Kansas Farm Bureau is governed by a board of directors who are farmers or ranchers, elected by their farmer/rancher Farm Bureau member peers. The membership also elects a farmer/rancher member to serve as president and vice president.

Kansas Farm Bureau policy comes directly from its members - Kansas farmers and ranchers. This member policy is heard in Washington, D.C., and Topeka as well as by county commissions, local zoning boards, town councils and school boards.
