
Title: Farm Bureau and the Courts: Opportunities and Successes

Description: As farm populations declined, the focus on agriculture in textbooks and classroom


learning diminished, leading to a growing gap in agricultural literacy shaped by misinformation. Incorporating agriculture into the classroom fosters positive






