

Sunflowers

- Striped sunflower seeds are eaten while black seeds are used to make oil.
- Sunflowers turn to follow the sun until they bloom.
- Sunflower roots can grow to a length of nine feet.





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- More than one-half of the world's oats are grown in the U.S. and Canada.
- In the United States, 95 percent of the oats grown are used for animal feed.





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- Kansas farmers export one-half of the wheat they grow.
- A bushel of wheat makes about 70 one-pound loaves of white bread.
- A bushel of wheat contains around one million kernels and weighs 60 pounds.
