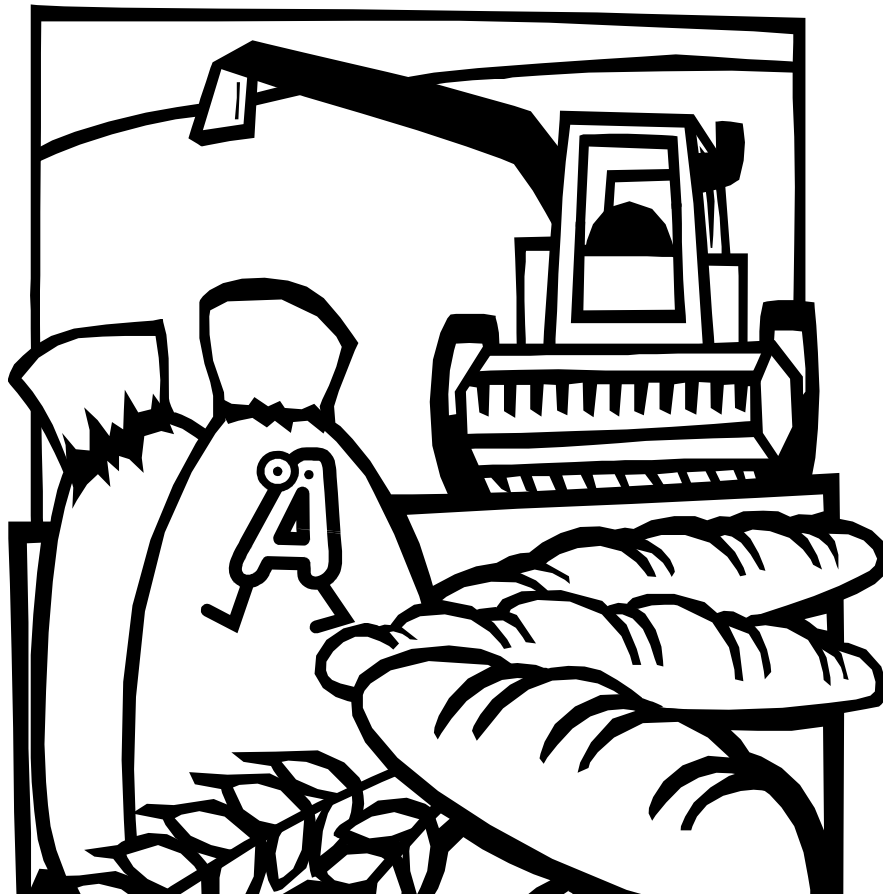

A a is for Agriculture.

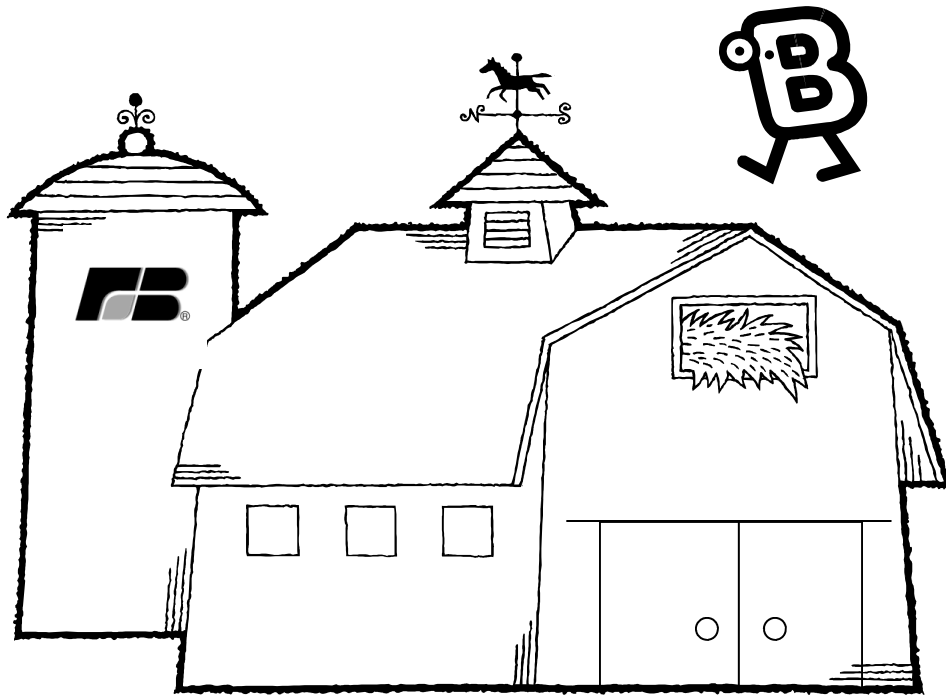
Agriculture is the science of cultivating the soil, producing crops and raising livestock.

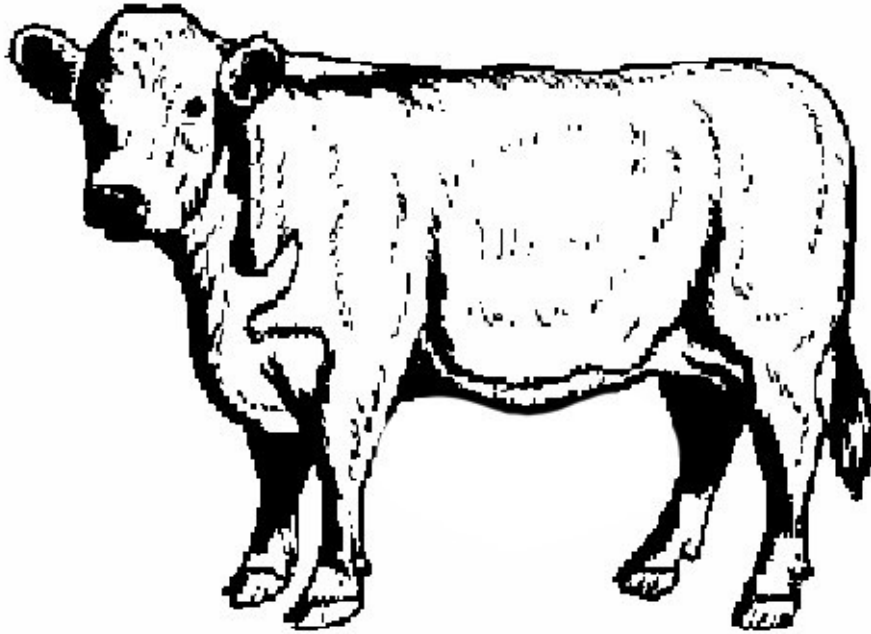


B b is for Barn.

The tall round building next to the barn is a silo (used to store livestock feed).



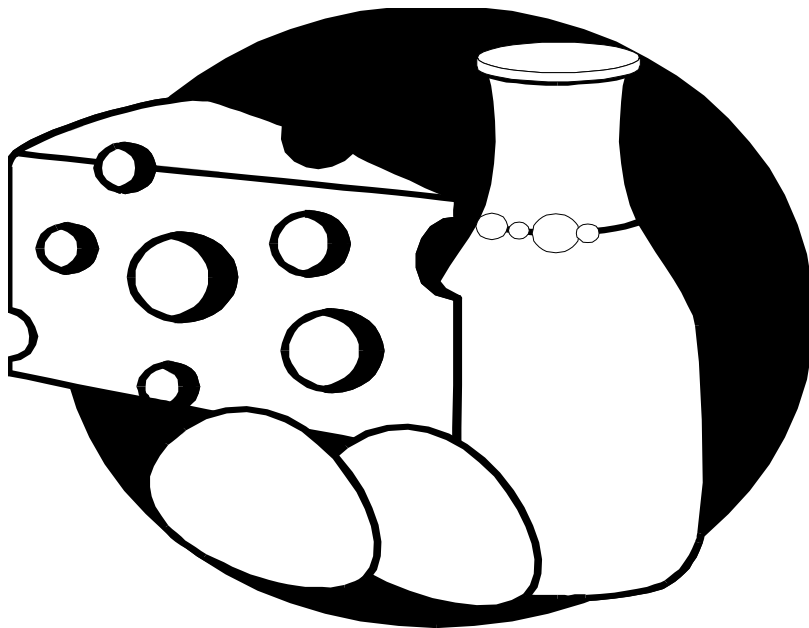


C C is for Cattle.

Milk, ice cream and cheese are all dairy products made from the milk of a dairy cow.

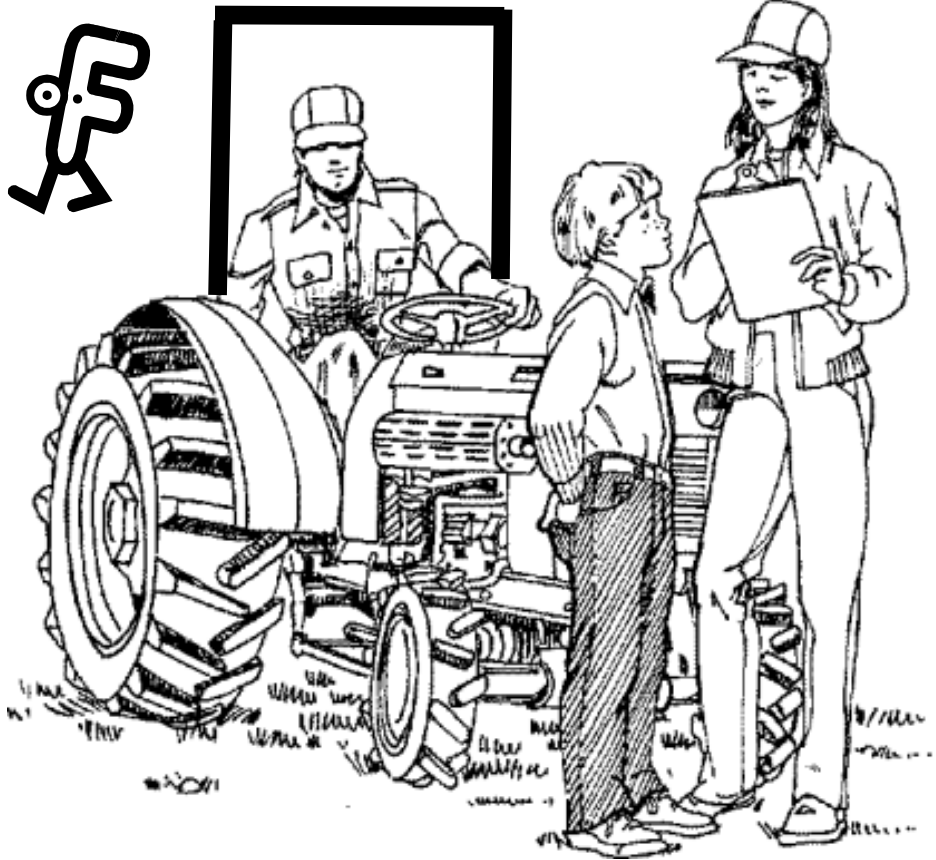


E e is for Egg.

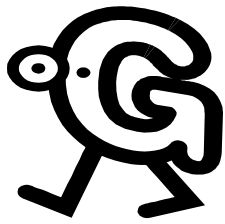
Eggs provide protein, are easy to prepare and best of all, taste great!



F **f** is for Farmer.



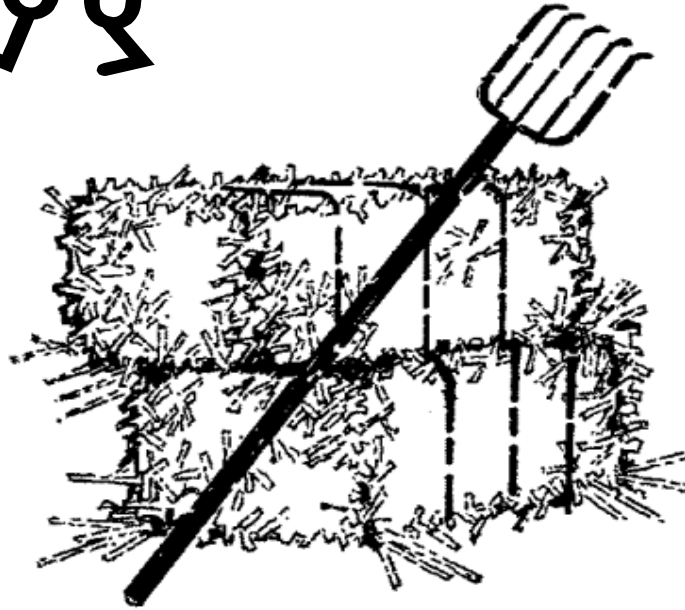
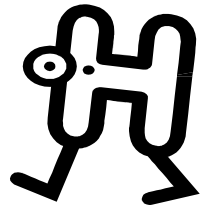
Farmers are men and women

G **g** is for Grain Sorghum.

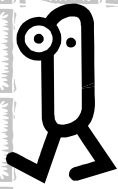
Kansas produces more Grain Sorghum (milo) than any other state in the United States.

L l is for Lamb.

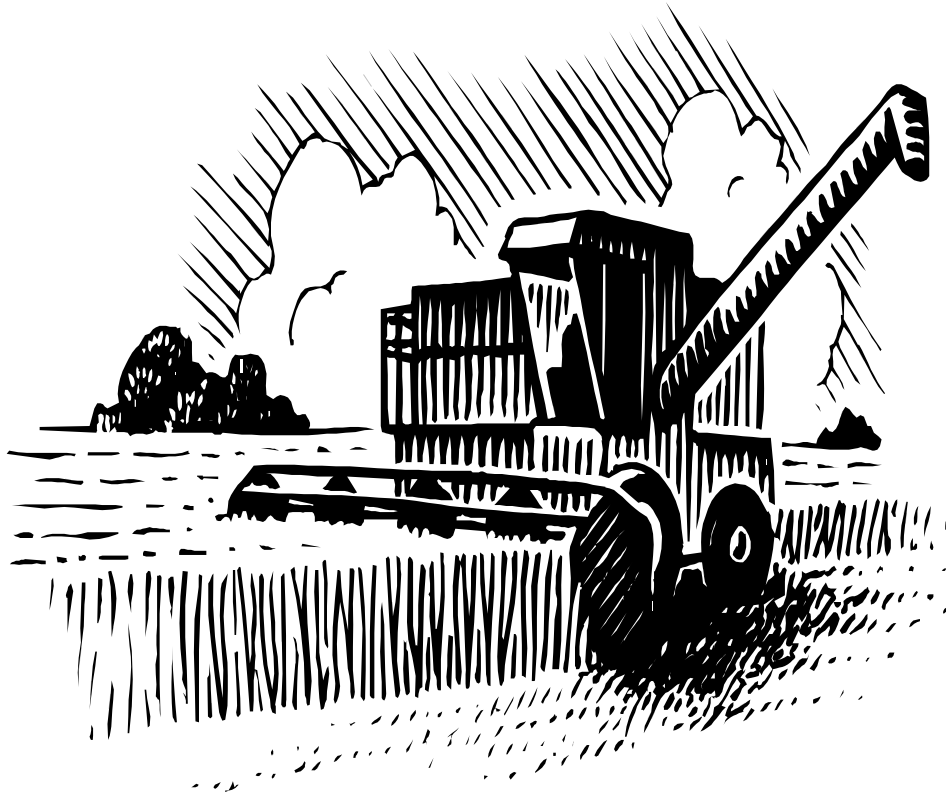
A lamb is a young sheep. A sheep's fleece provides wool to make clothing and blankets.

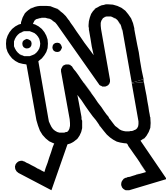

Machines help farmers produce crops and raise livestock.





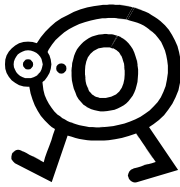

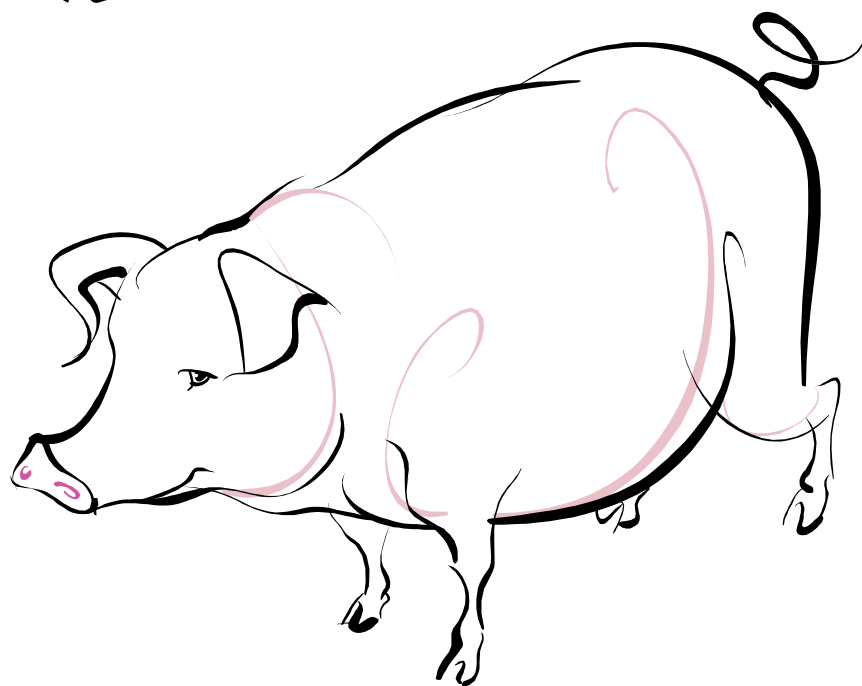
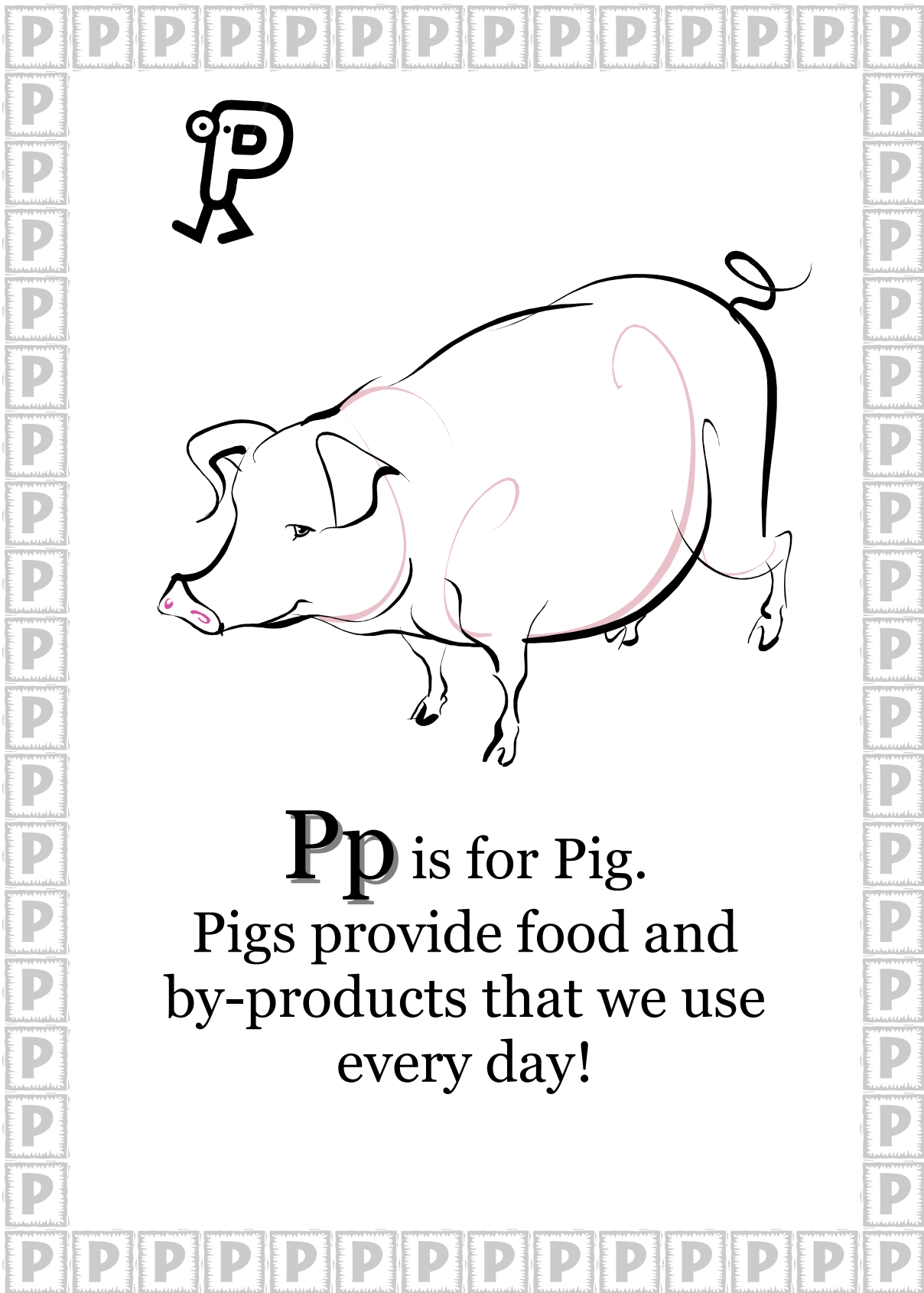


Farmers grow good food for us to eat. Good nutrition helps us to stay healthy.

animals.





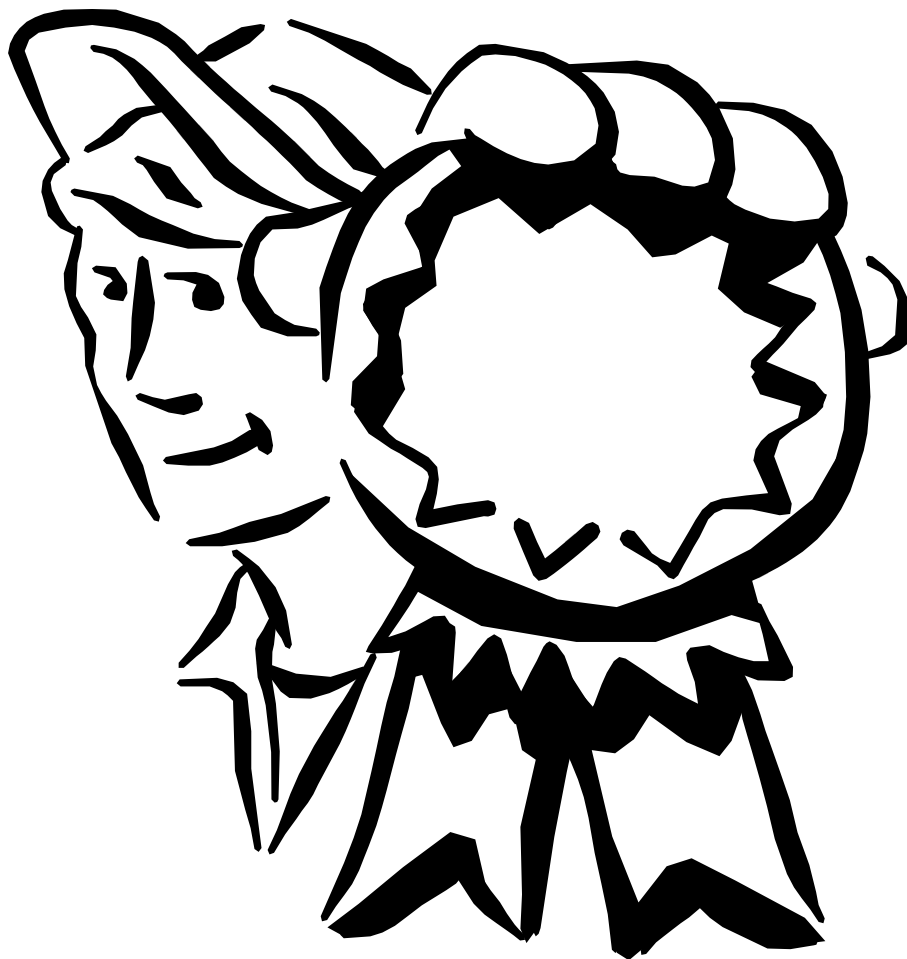

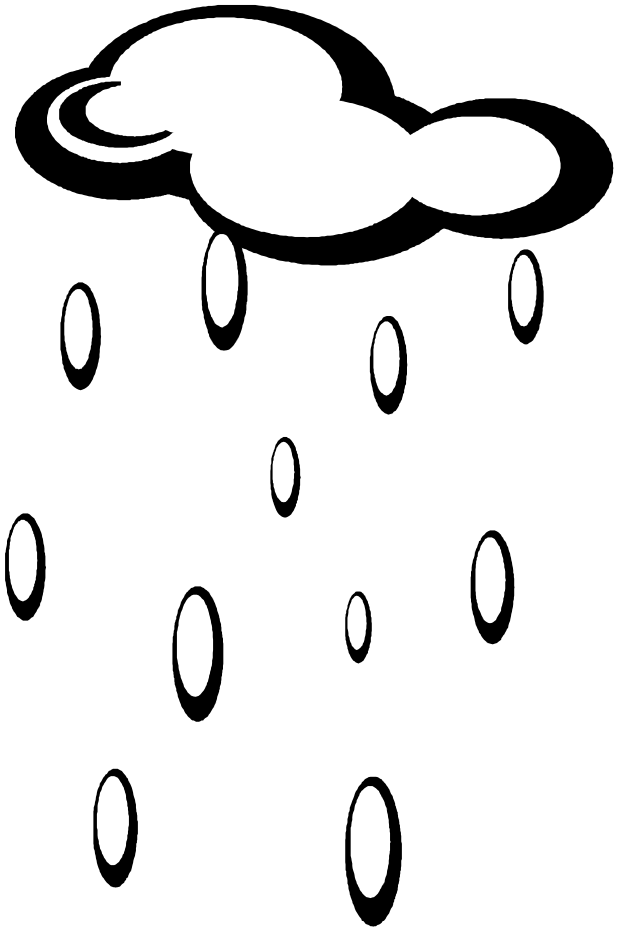
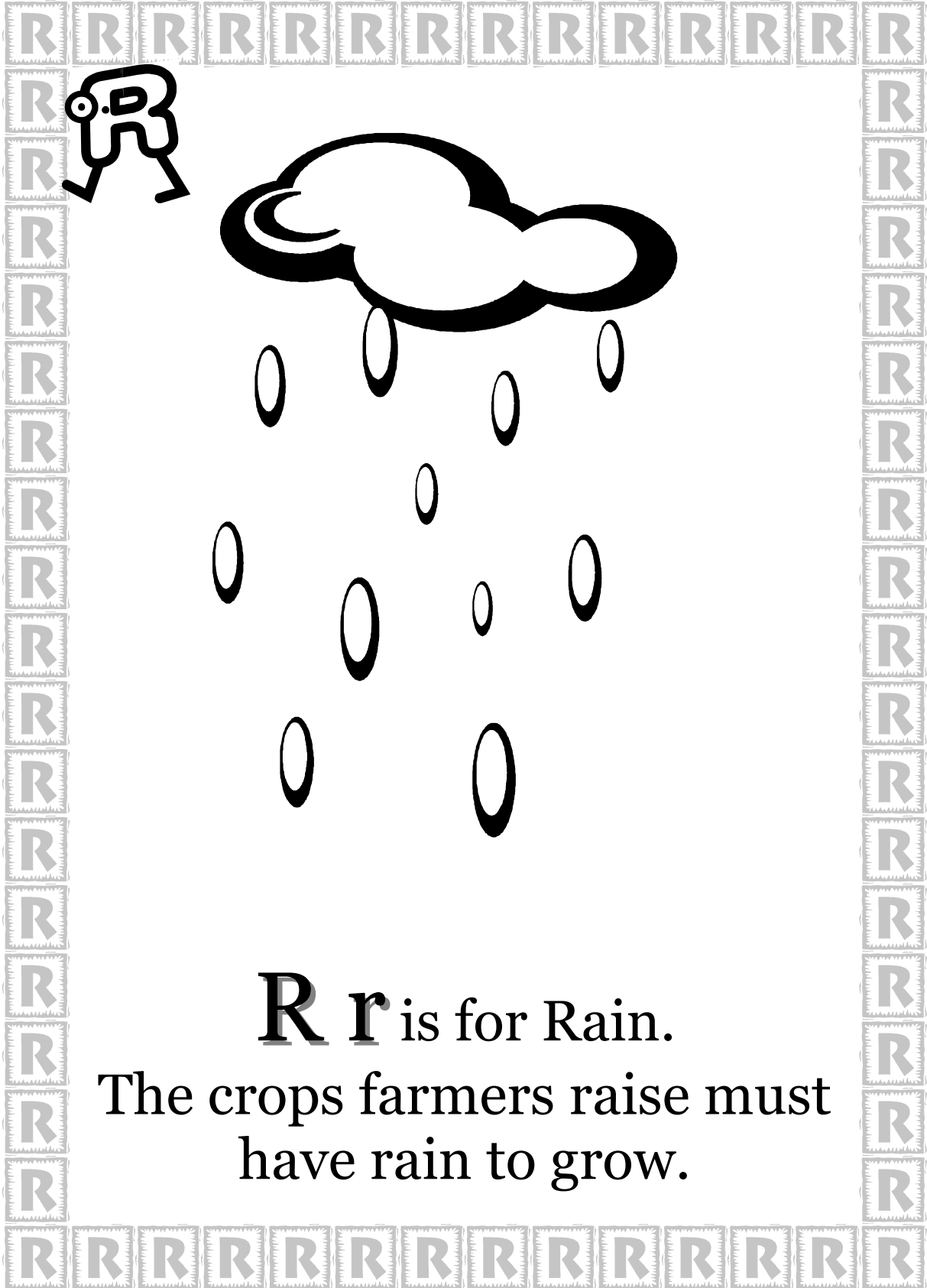

quality food for you and me.



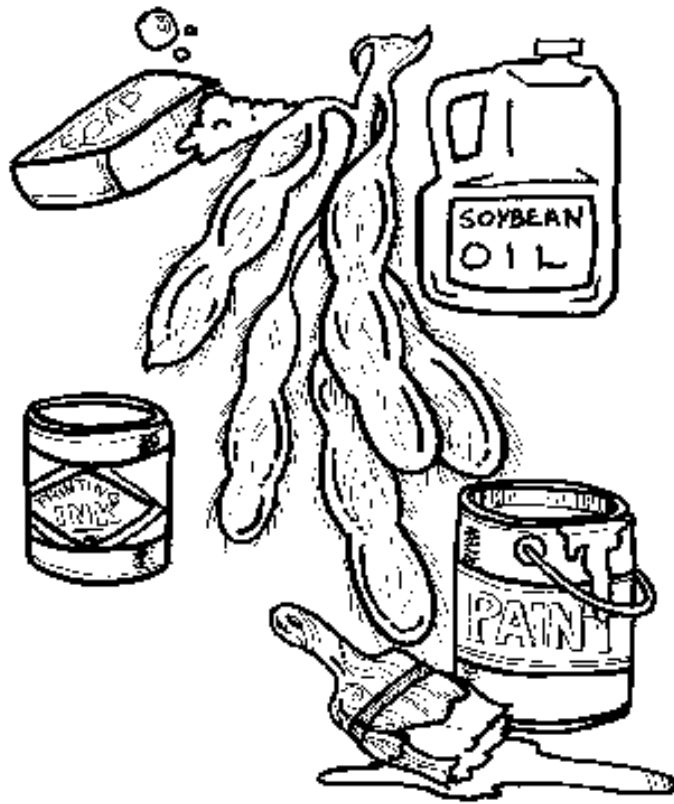


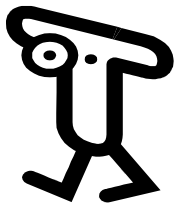
R r is for Rain.

Soybeans can be found in many products we use, such as soap, cooking oil, ink, paint, candles and margarine.



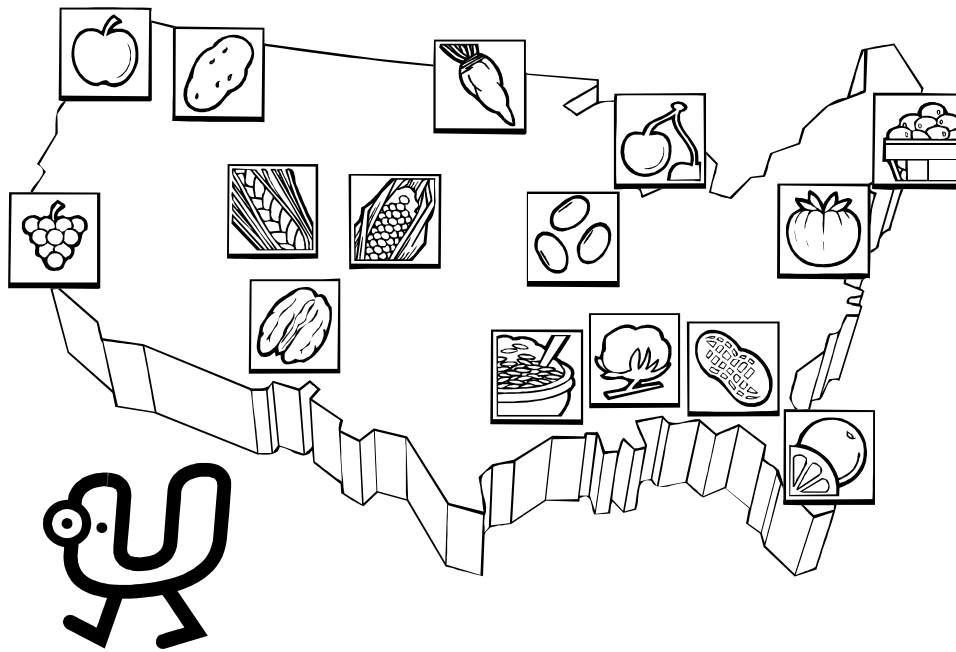


T t is for Tractor.

Farmers and ranchers live all over the United States. They grow many kinds of grains for food and fuel, as well as raise livestock.



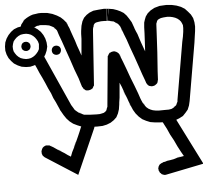

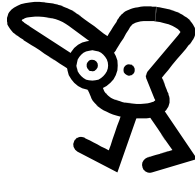
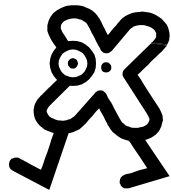


Farmers grow vegetables like
