

A a is for Agriculture.


Agriculture is the science of cultivating the soil, producing crops and raising livestock.




B b is for Barn. A barn provides shelter for animals, feed and equipment. The tall round building next to the barn is a silo (used to store livestock feed).



Dd is for Dairy. Milk, ice cream and cheese are all dairy products made from the milk of a dairy cow.




$\mathbf{F} \mathbf{f}$ is for Farmer.





Farmers are men and women that provide food, fuel and fiber for the world.












L l is for Lamb. A lamb is a young sheep. A sheep's fleece provides wool to make clothing and blankets.




N n is for Nutrition





Farmers grow good food for us N to eat. Good nutrition helps us N to stay healthy.















T t is for Tractor.
