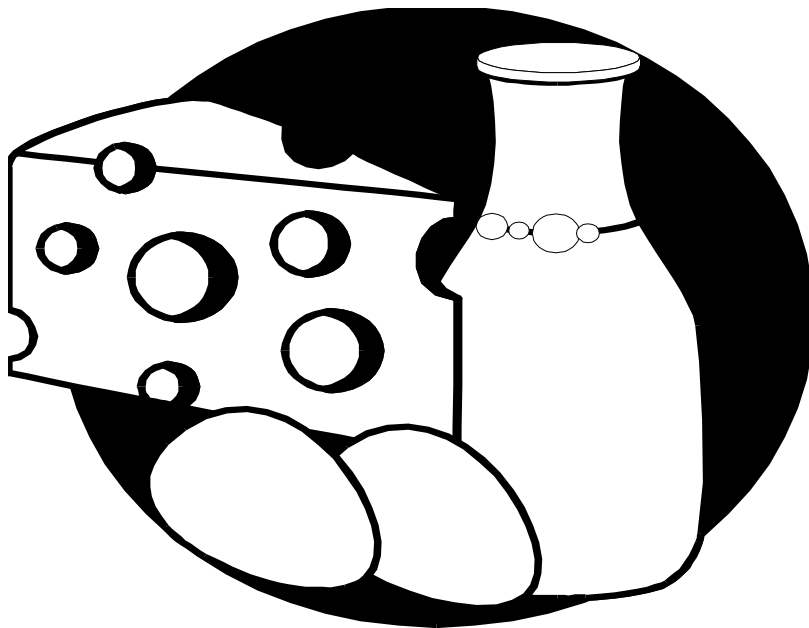
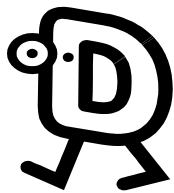
C C is for Cattle.

Milk, ice cream and cheese are all dairy products made from the milk of a dairy cow.

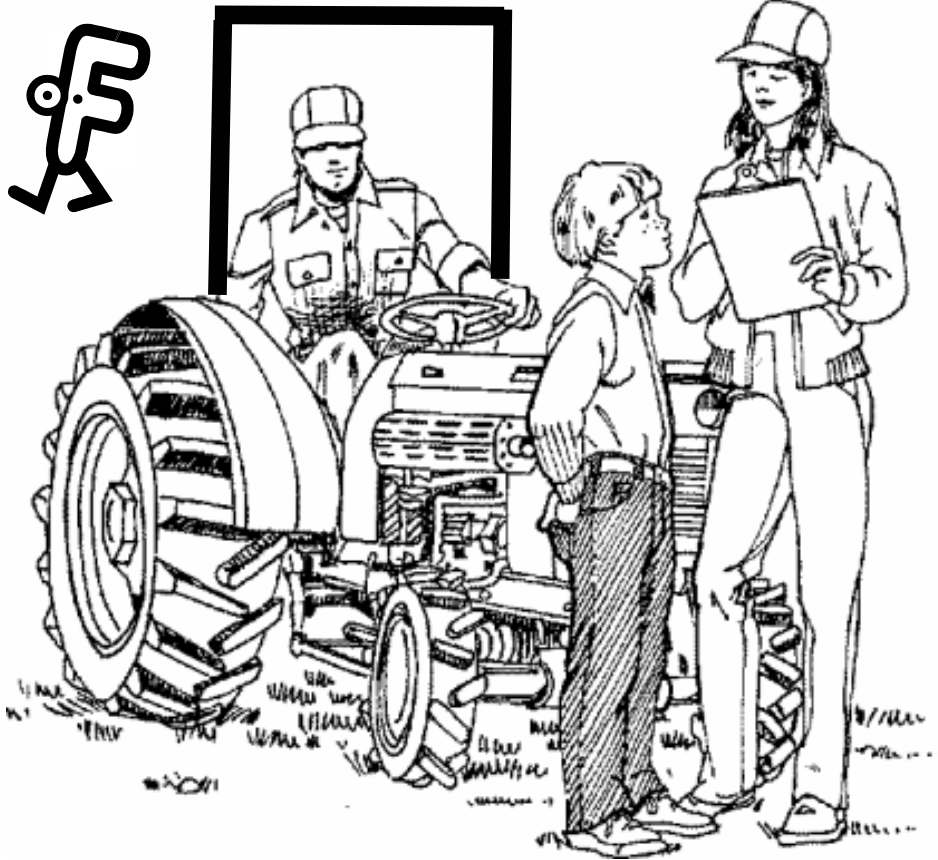


E e is for Egg.

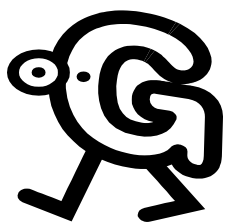
Eggs provide protein, are easy to prepare and best of all, taste great!



F **f** is for Farmer.



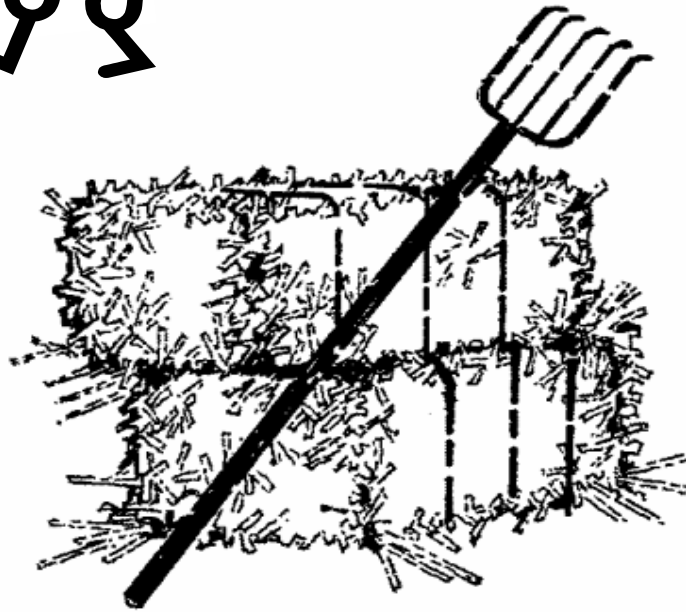
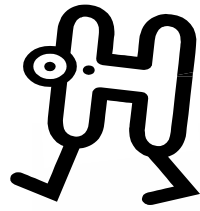
Farmers are men and women

G **g** is for Grain Sorghum.

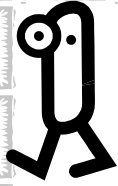
Kansas produces more Grain Sorghum (milo) than any other state in the United States.

I i is for Industry.

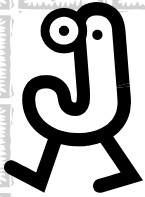

L l is for Lamb.

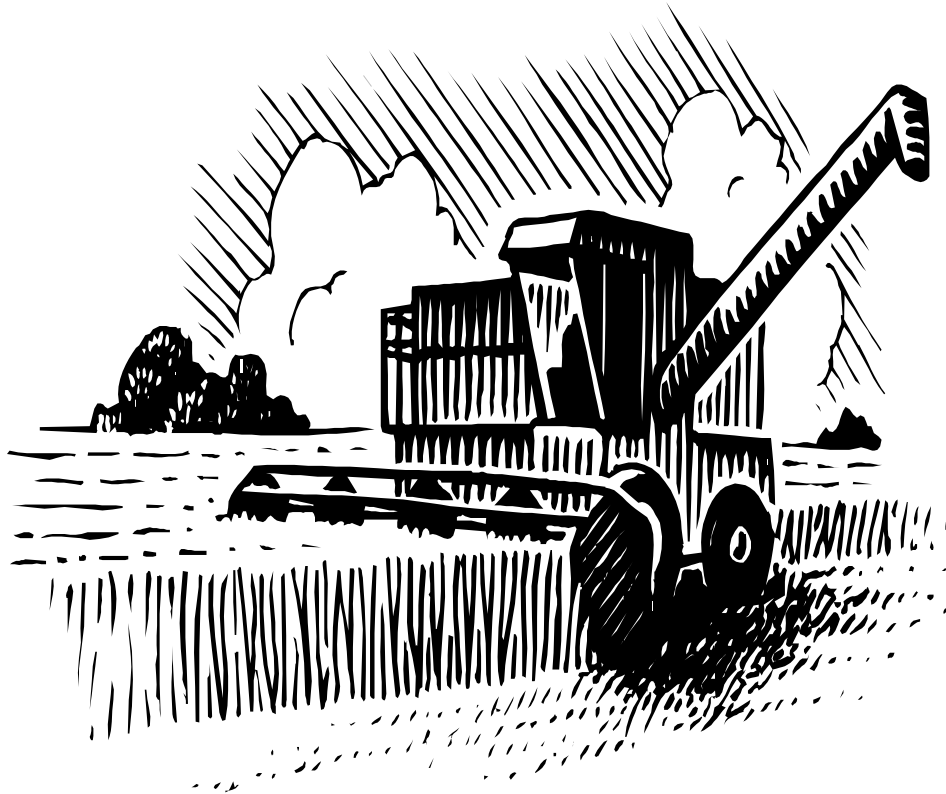
A lamb is a baby sheep. A sheep's coat is used to make wool. We use wool to make warm clothes, such as sweaters and jackets.

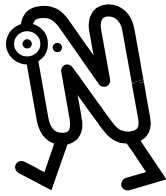




M m is for Machine.

Machines help farmers produce crops and raise livestock.





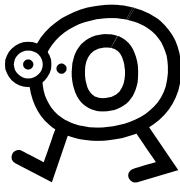

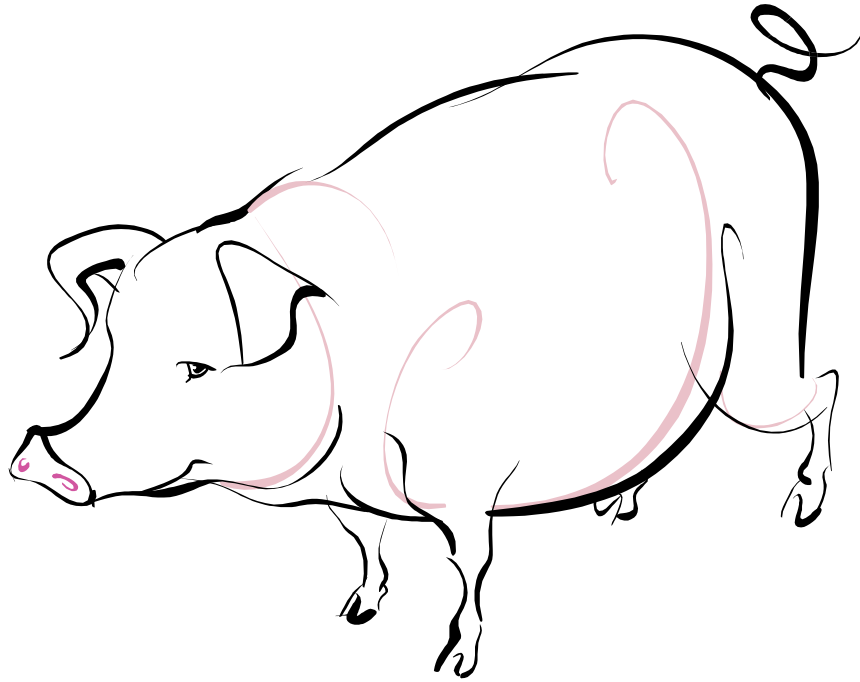
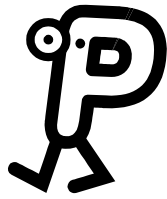
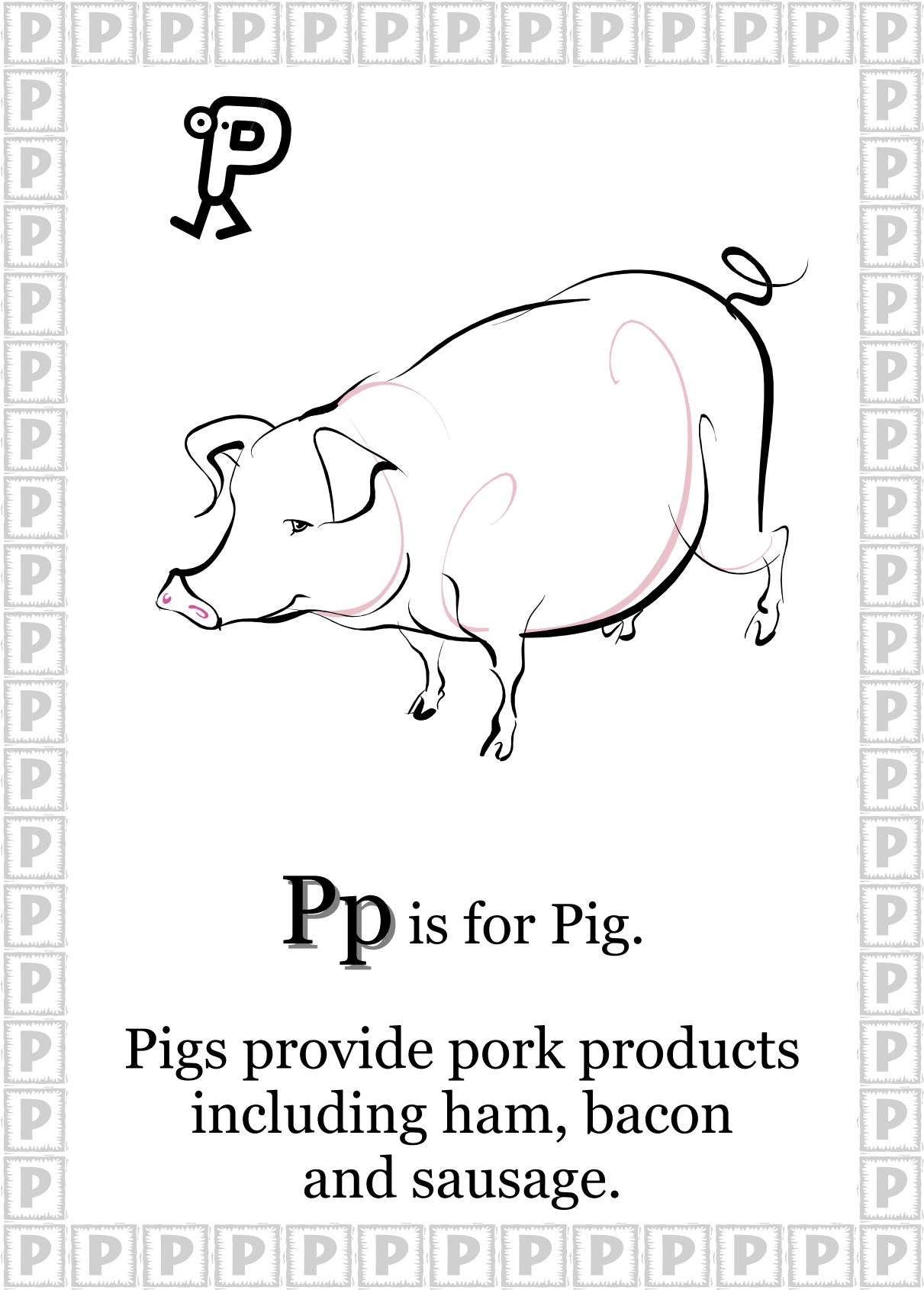


Farmers grow good food for us to eat. Good nutrition helps us to stay healthy.

animals.





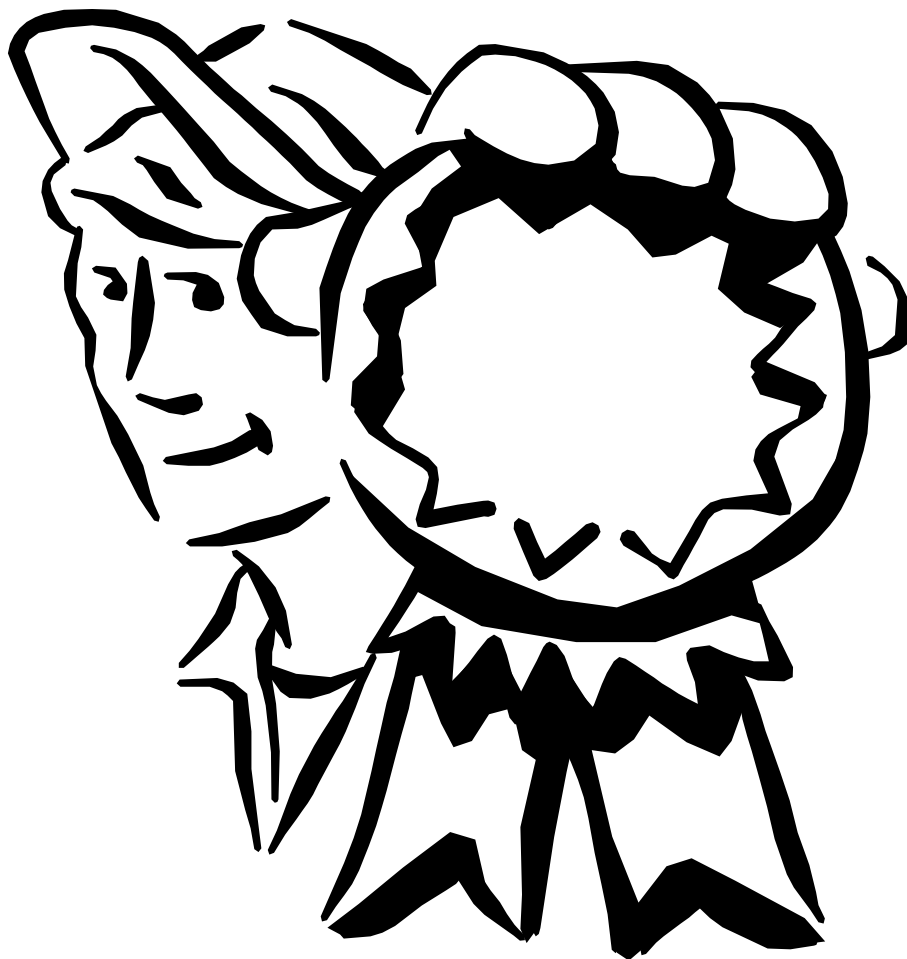
Pp is for Pig.

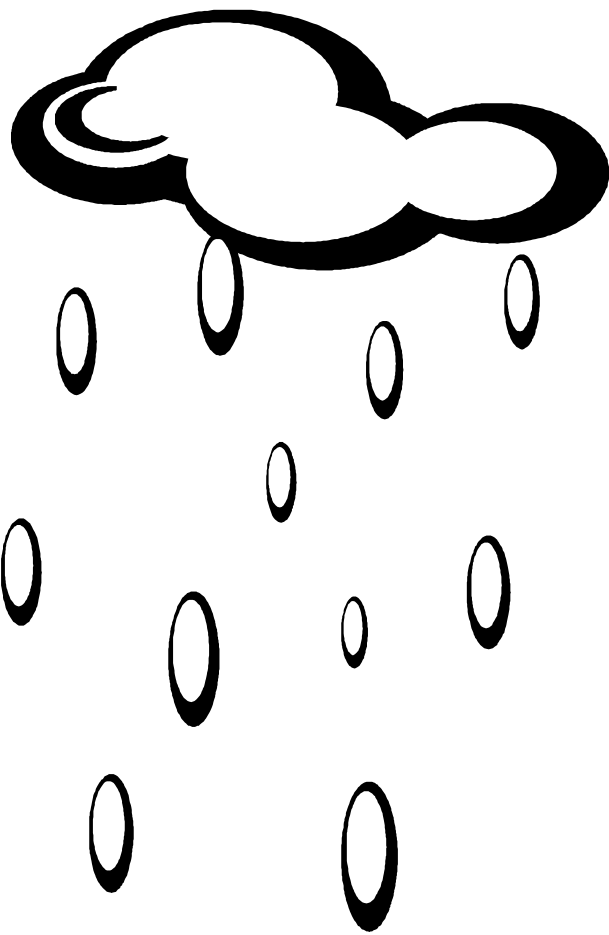
Pigs provide pork products including ham, bacon and sausage.

quality food for you and me.





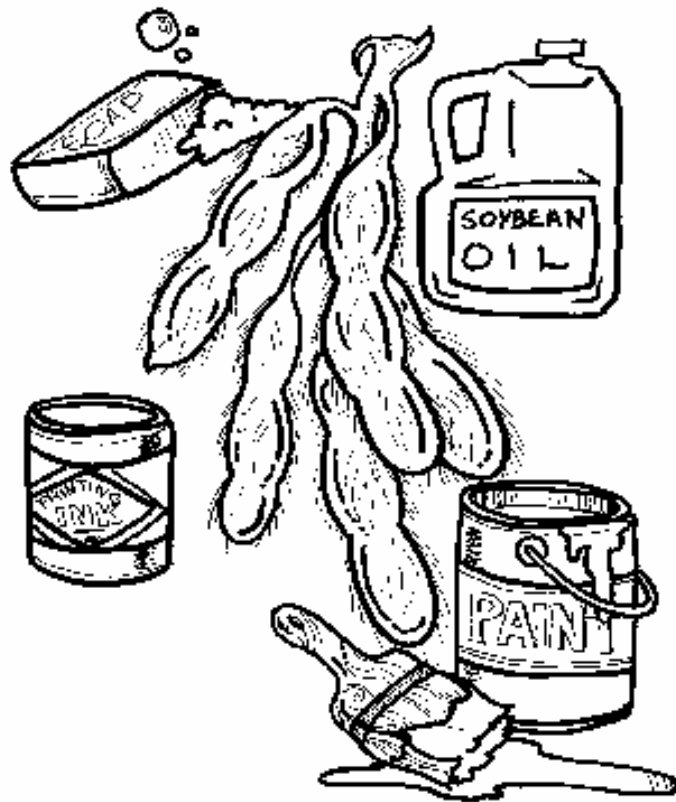
R r is for Rain.

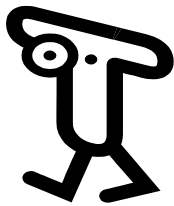
The crops farmers raise must

Soybeans can be found in many products we use, such as soap, cooking oil, ink, paint, candles and margarine.



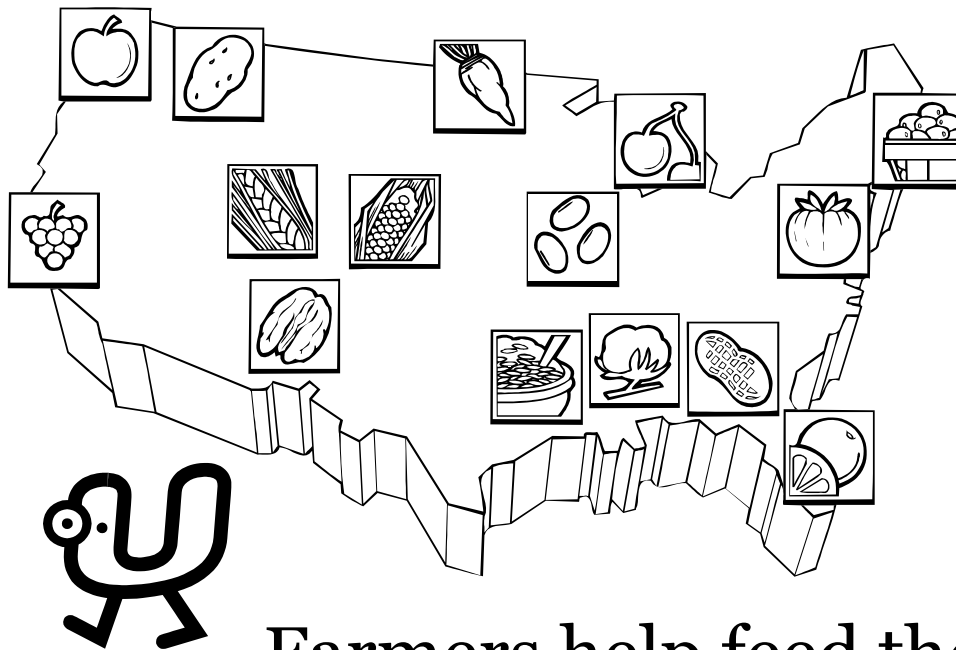


T t is for Tractor.

Farmers live all over the United States. They grow different kinds of grains, food and fuel, as well as raise livestock.



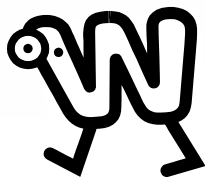
Farmers help feed the world.

V V is for Vegetable.

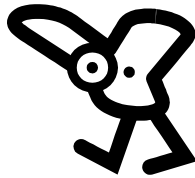
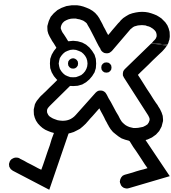


Farmers grow vegetables like
